SUBJECT: Environmental Commitment Statement

- 1. IAW Department of the Air Force Instruction (DAFI) 32-7001, *Environmental Management*, the 910th Airlift Wing reaffirms commitment to integrating responsible, cost-effective environmental stewardship into all activities, products, and services performed in support of maintaining a combat-ready Air Force Reserve unit at Youngstown Air Reserve Station. Our specific mission priorities include deploying, training, and developing to prepare Combat Ready ALWAYS! Airmen for mobilization and deployments as tasked with the utmost pride, attitude, and integrity. Our team is prepared to deliver operational and support requirements to fly C-130 aircraft to provide agile combat support and employment, tactical airlift, and aerial spray missions. Environmental concerns for this regional/local area include maintaining air quality, protecting Ohio's water resources, and managing waste materials in a manner that reduces the land disposal burden.
- 2. As a wing, we commit to continual improvement, prevention of pollution, and compliance with relevant environmental laws and regulations, Executive Orders, and DoD and Air Force policies. In conjunction with the comprehensive recurring self-assessment processes prescribed by the Air Force Inspection System, we will maintain our installation-level Environmental Management System (EMS) as the framework for setting goals and reviewing progress toward environmental objectives and targets, including any required by the Department of Defense, Headquarters Air Force, and/or the Air Force Civil Engineer Center.
- 3. IAW DAFI 32-7001, this commitment statement will be annually reviewed by the wing's Environment, Safety and Occupational Health Council and Cross-Functional Team; will be communicated to all persons working for or on behalf of the wing via email workflow distribution; and will be made available to the public via posting on the wing's public website.
