






### 910th Aircraft Assigned and Structure

# 910th Airlift Wing Tactical Airlift Missions

In wartime, the 910th Airlift Wing mission is to employ the Lockheed C-130 Hercules aircraft in combat operations of tactical airlift. These operations include low-level infiltration into a combat environment, where aircrews can deliver personnel and materials by airdrop and air-land techniques. The 910th Aircraft Maintenance Squadron and 910th Maintenance Squadron ensure aircraft and ground support equipment are in good working order and ready to support the mission.



### **Recent missions:**

• February – May 2022: More than 140 members from the 910th Airlift Wing's flying, maintenance and other ground support squadrons deployed to provide airlift operations to various military installations and operations, including East Africa Response Force and Joint Special Operations Task Force Somalia, in support of Combined Joint Task Force-Horn of Africa Area of Operations (AOR).

This AFRICOM tasking was a first for AFRC as the mission was previously completed by active-duty units. These 910th Citizen Airmen and aircraft completed 1555 flying hours during 124 combat & combat support missions. These missions consisted of 346 sorties transporting 1,650 passengers as well as 2.4 million pounds of cargo and equipment to warfighters with a 99% mission effectiveness rate.



### 910th Airlift Wing Aerial Spray Mission

# 910th is home to the DoD's only Aerial Spray capability and dedicated Aerial Spray Maintenance Flight

Missions include: Insect Control, Vegetation control on bombing ranges and Oil spill neutralization

#### **Recurring annual missions:**

• 13 DoD installations in the states of Ariz., Fla., Ga., Idaho, Kansas, Nev., N.D., S.C., Utah and Va.

#### **Innovative Readiness Training missions:**

In some cases, communities near DoD installations such as Minot, N.D., request aerial spray support through the DoD Innovative Readiness Training (IRT) program.



#### **Recent Emergency Operations:**

• Oct 2020 – 85 Reserve Citizen Airmen and three C-130s assigned to the 910th deployed to conduct aerial spray operations to treat more than 900,000 acres in southern Louisiana for mosquito control in the aftermath of Hurricanes Laura and Delta.



# 2017 Hurricane Harvey Aerial Spray

- First Emergency Aerial Spray Operations using Night Vision
- Total acres sprayed 2,701,071 (Approx. twice the area of Delaware)
- Sorties 28 over eastern Texas
- Total Flying Time 138.6 hours
- Gallons of mosquito control product 14,570







### 2010 Deepwater Horizon Aerial Spray

- The 910th conducted oil dispersing aerial spray operations to aid in the cleanup efforts in the aftermath of the explosion of the BP Deepwater Horizon drilling platform
  - Total acres sprayed 30,094
  - Sorties 93 over Gulf of Mexico
  - Total Flying Time 150.9
  - Gallons of dispersant 148,956
